Shovel reclaimed dye and absorbent into a recovery or salvage drums for disposal. For larger spills, transfer to a salvage tank for recovery or safe disposal. Any residues should be treated like a small spill. This is not a RCRA hazardous waste per Title 40 CFR 261. Stop material from contaminating soil, or from entering sewers or bodies of water. For larger spills, transfer to a salvage tank for safe recovery/disposal. Residues are treated as small spills.
